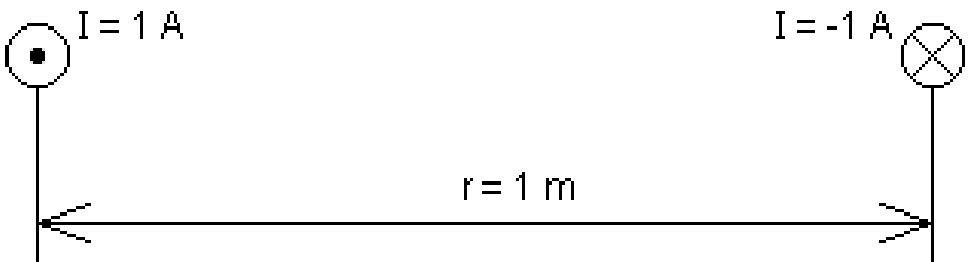


# QuickField simulation report

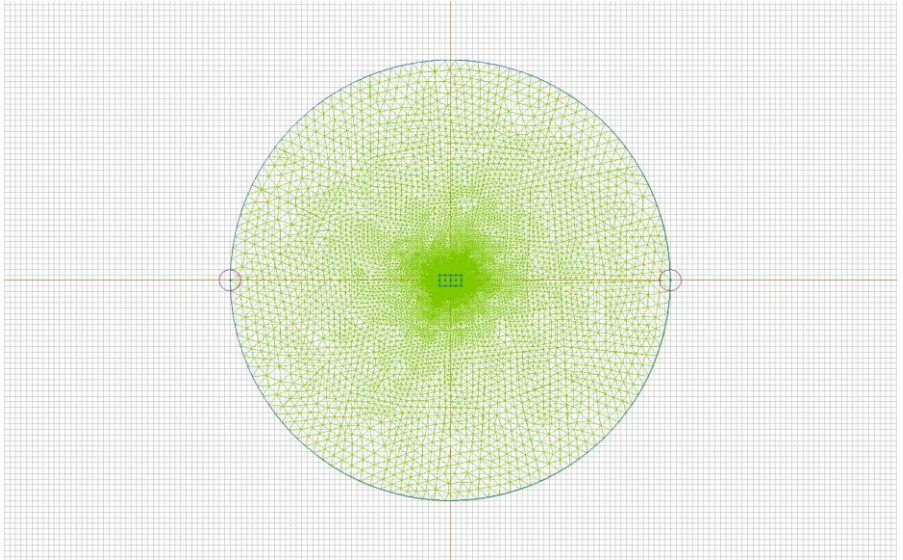

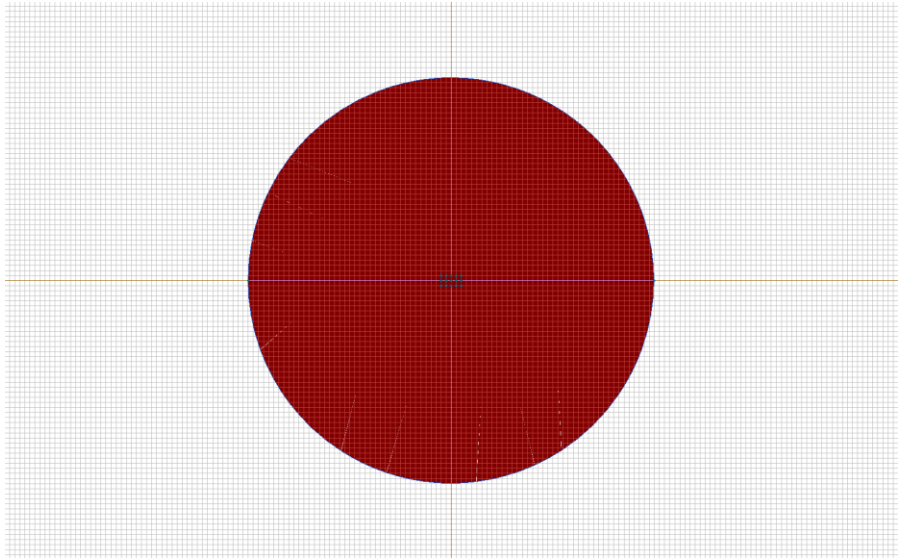
Labelled objects: block "air"

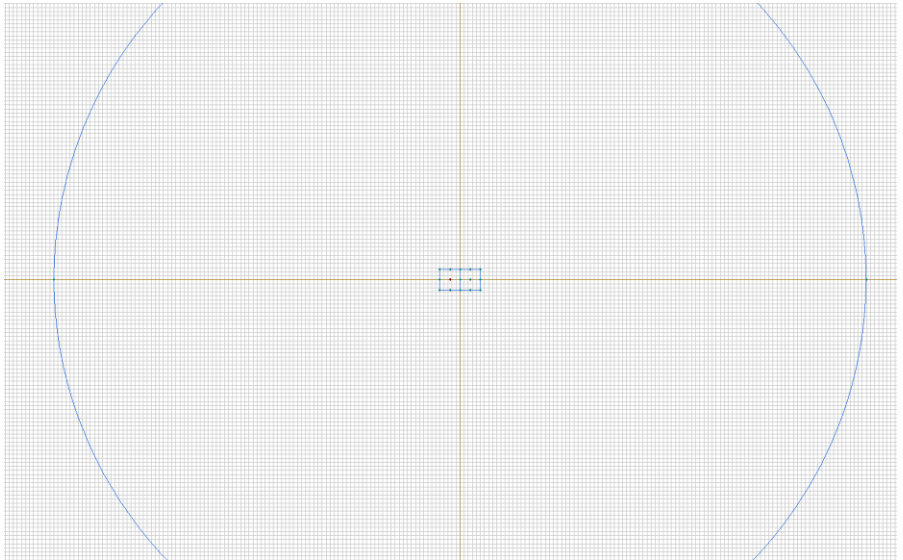
Conductor's connection: in parallel

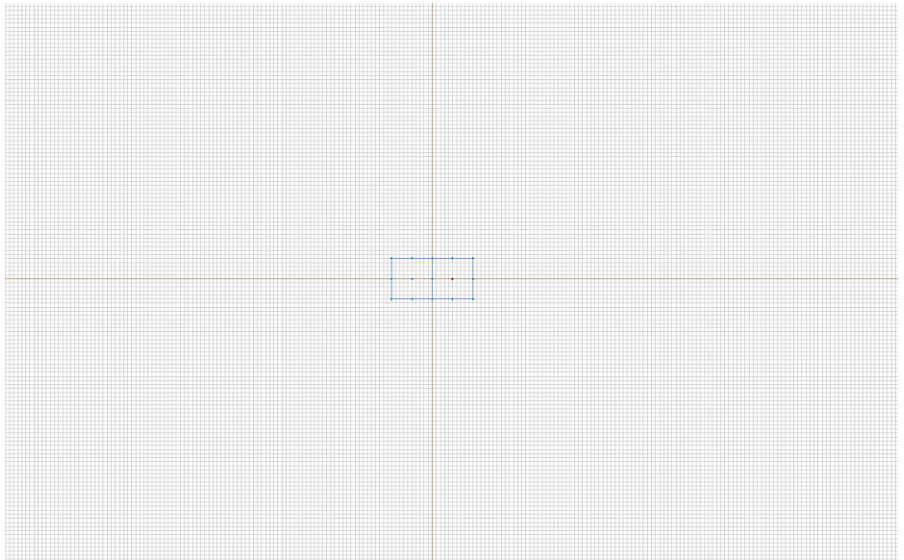

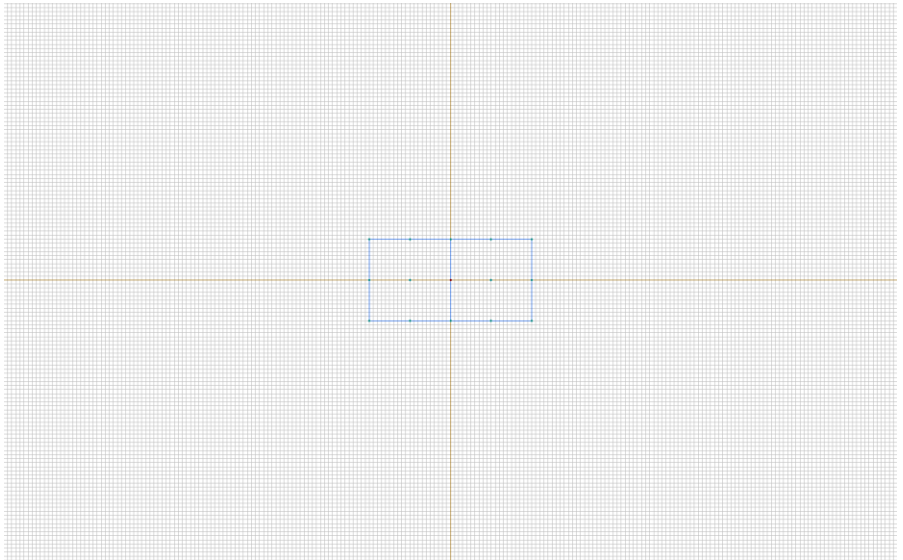

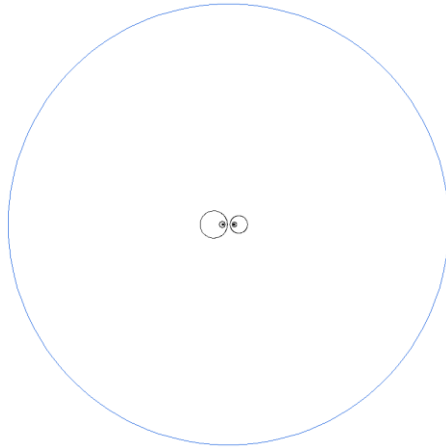

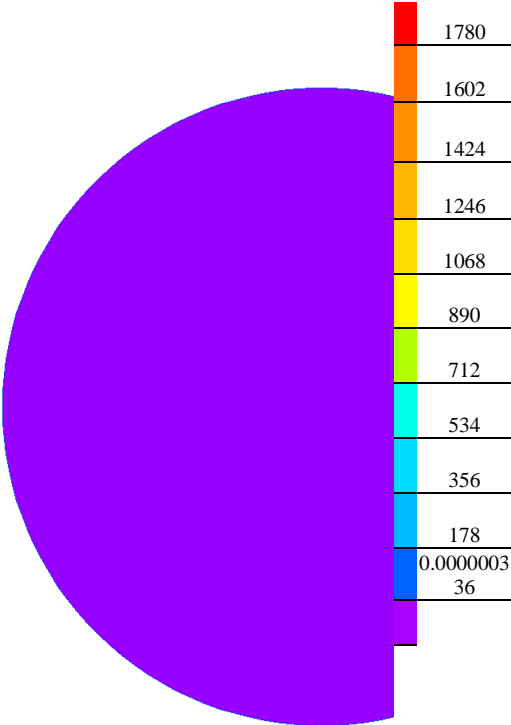
